ICAPS is pleased to announce the recent completion of a three-car/five-stop elevator modernization project for an office building in Charlotte, North Carolina. HICAPS' relationship with the property owner began back in 2015, when we performed construction quality assurance monitoring for a tenant improvement project in Greensboro. Several other successful projects followed, leading the property owner to place their trust in HICAPS for an elevator modernization in a high-traffic office building.

The existing elevators were more than 20 years old, had been poorly maintained and were well beyond their expected service life. HICAPS issued an RFP and conducted site visits with multiple qualified elevator vendors and trades. Upon vendor selection, the equipment was manufactured over a period of 12 weeks. During this time, much of the "work by others" was performed. A minisplit HVAC system was installed in the machine room, and extensive upgrades to



the electrical and lighting systems were completed along with upgrades to the fire alarm system.

Elevator modernization projects have multiple layers of complexity: a crane lift to a roof-top elevator machine room is required; modernization must progress while keeping the other elevators in operation; longer wait times and more crowding in cars needs to be reduced for the building occupants; tenant expectations need to be managed and noise, dust and dirt need to be minimized in what is essentially an operating office environment.

HICAPS' ultimate goal was to provide



an excellent product and service to our client. They now have elevators with improved reliability, ride quality and much improved energy efficiency.

Hiram Ward Federal Building Elevator Modernization Project

HICAPS is currently performing another elevator modernization project. This unique designbuild project for the General Services Administration (GSA) is set to modernize the elevators at the Hiram Ward Federal Building and U.S. Courthouse. This highlights HICAPS' ability to manage




complex scopes of work. HICAPS worked with Stewart Elevator Consulting to develop a scope of work for the modernization of the elevators to include electrical and fire alarm updates. We have successfully completed all four passenger elevators as well as the service elevator.

During the course of construction, it was decided to completely replace the judges' elevator and to extend the elevator service up to the fourth floor. HICAPS has

With changing times and being one of eight federal training facilities in the country, MSHA is preparing to open their facility to other training programs and to house their new guests to save on hotel stays. They are revamping once again, and HICAPS has been there to help.
